- 2) 7:30 PM Concert at the SBE School. Prices are posted on the [Seldovia Arts Council website](#).

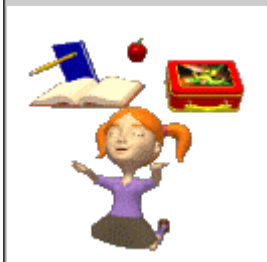

Shrink Wrapping Comes to Seldovia

Dave Cloninger and Paul Chissus started a new business in Seldovia this fall - shrink-wrapping boats. In addition to shrink-wrapping boats, you can also protect items such as trailers, motor homes, vehicles, equipment, engines, fire wood, etc. The cost is \$15 per linear foot. Items can be shrink-wrapped at pretty much any location, weather permitting of course.



Shrink-wrapping protects your valuables against water, dust, wind, snow, and sun damage (if the sun shines ha, ha). Air vents are installed, at no extra charge, so moisture doesn't build up in the sealed item. An access door can also be installed, for a small additional fee, so you can get in and out of your boat or RV, if you desire.

Some people have been storing their boats in Homer, because they wanted

them shrink-wrap protected during the winter months. Now that this service is available in Seldovia, they can store their boats right here in Seldovia!

Joint Fire Fighting Training in Seldovia

The dynamic photo story of the fire extinguisher training activity in last weeks Seldovia Gazette was one segment of a three-day Rural Basic Firefighter Training recently offered in Seldovia. Sponsored by the SVT Barabara Heights VFD, firefighters from SVF&EMS and Port Graham were also welcomed and participated whole-heartedly; eighteen in all, including two instructors.

We had the privilege of learning from Bud Rotroff and Jan Dick; these instructors came to us from the State of Alaska Fire Service. They have fought fires (including wildland fires) and trained firefighters for over forty years.

The first day's classroom learning included fire science, fire behavior, strategies and tactics for fire suppression, and use of fire extinguishers.

On the second day we trained using small pump handling, drafting from water sources other than hydrants. We also practiced using the Aqueous Film Forming Foam (AFFF) tanks and hose for suppressing fires.

Day three covered wildland fire training, patterns of fire expansion and containment, and important fire prevention measures to practice and pass on to others. Above all, SAFETY of firefighters and those involved in the scene of the fire was emphasized.

A good time was had by all, instructors as well as students. We went home with new skills, more knowledge, and new friends. We confirmed that we want to do this again and the instructors want to return to our community.

City Council Meeting - September 27

The Seldovia City Council convened together to include the following members: Councilmen Keith Gain (presiding), Tom Glover, Tom Keesecker, Walter McInnes and Councilwoman Gerry Patrick. Mayor Wyland has an excused absence with City Manager Kurt Reynertson present and City Clerk Ronda Haynes taking minutes.

Treasurer's Report

A summary sheet was provided for public viewing. The major maintenance and repair line items have been fully funded. The liability insurance has already been paid for the year. Fuel expenses were higher than anticipated.

Ordinance Introduction

Ordinance 07-02, Zoning Code Amendment

This ordinance will be delayed until the next regularly scheduled City Council Meeting. This ordinance will be referred to the Planning & Zoning Commission first, then subsequently reviewed and written by CM Reynertson for Council review.

Committee and Advisory Board Reports

Planning & Zoning will meet this coming Monday on October 2nd. Chairwoman Paulie Carluccio noted that on the Borough level they are continuing to rename some of the streets. Carluccio emphasized that it is becoming clearer with each subsequent meeting she is attending that rules are crucial to the structure of our future buildings. Exceptions can be made, but too "loose" of wording can do harm. Rules that are well thought-out and worded correctly protect the City and surrounding areas from indiscriminate building practices.

Fish & Game will have an advisory meeting toward the end of November.
17B Trails and **SOS** have nothing to report at this time
Chamber of Commerce will meet next Thursday on October 5th.

Old Business

Review and Discussion of 4-Wheeler Abuse Presented by Ron Turner at 9/13/06 Council Meeting. (McInnes)

This review & discussion was put on the docket by Councilman McInnes in response to a member of the Public, Ron Turner, who submitted a letter regarding after- hours ATV Abuse (noise and associated activity). McInnes feels that Council response is warranted as a member of our community has come forward with a complaint on this matter. Other members of the Public spoke about this issue. *Myself*, having one son that uses the 4-Wheeler noted that we have advised our son about responsibilities that come with the privilege of the operation of an ATV. Furthermore, I felt that the kids need clear guidelines established that they will be required to adhere to.

Mike Driscol spoke about the donut cutting, revving up the engines, backfiring, etc. and hopes this behavior doesn't get "out of hand," causing everyone to lose the privilege of ATV use. Driscol indicated that when he was young it was just common sense to be quieter when in residential areas. In addition, he commented that the noise bothers him, but no more than the all-night dog barking, loud music or the screaming drunkards making their way home.

Happy Schneider mentioned that she hears them (as her residence is on Main Street). She feels the "rabble-rousing" is coming more from the adults coming out of the bar, than the teens on their ATV's, at least in town; she feels the kids have to be able to go somewhere.

SBE Junior, *Timmy O'Leary* eloquently spoke that he was "elated" at the age of 14, to be able to take himself from place to place instead of pressing his parents' into service. He thinks that a specific "sound curfew" may be in order, rather than a drastic "ban" on ATV use by teens'.

Paul Chissus spoke in support of Ron Turner's right to speak out on the late night noise. Additionally, Chissus feels the kids' need some guidance to pursue an activity that he feels is mostly a very healthy outlet. He hopes that an all-out ban on what is a wonderful privilege will not be the outcome.

Dan Blodgett commented in support of Turner's right to speak out. Blodgett feels all the kids really need are some rules; with those rules would come consequences that are significant enough to deter the activity. Blodgett said an alternative might be to get something going for the City to get an "ATV-track" out at the old dumpsite (with signed hold harmless agreements from the City). They (the youth) have to have some outlet or they may opt to do the wrong thing.

City Manager Reynertson noted the teen part of the audience of 8 was in the audience tonight because they care enough to be. Reynertson supports Mr. Turner in his complaint about the noise. It is his right as a citizen to expect a full night's sleep. Instead of going through and instituting a bunch of new rules and regulations he would prefer that the teens self-police their behavior and recognize whom may be disturbed by their actions.

Councilman Gain thinks we need to enforce the laws that we have.

Councilman McInnes made a motion that acknowledges receipt of Ron Turner's letter in addition to Reynertson's collaboration with local police. To also advise the Kenai Peninsula Borough to potentially lock the gate if any further negative response or unreasonable noise occurs; concurrence of the City of Seldovia before action takes place is requested.

Action: Approved unanimously.

Award of bid for Small Boat Harbor Renovations

The City has approximately 1.5 million dollars available and the lowest renovation bid was approximately 2.6 million dollars. Based upon those bids, Council opted to go with a Letter of Intent to proceed with the lowest bidder, Jay-Brant, and requested a de-scoping of the project to match available funds. The revised bid price was 1.75 million. Which is still a shortfall of

approximately \$250,000. Options and discussions dealing with this shortfall were discussed with in Executive Session.

After the Executive Session ended, a motion was made to -- [Editors note: wording of the motion was not available - it will be added Friday morning]

Action: Approved unanimously.

Union Negotiations (executive session)

Action: None

New Business

Land Bid submitted for Lot 5A, Block 27, Seldovia Townsite Replat

This 50K bid has been offered for the above lot and would be utilized for a parking lot. This would service the house (formerly owned by the Polsky's) directly across the street on Shoreline Drive . The minimum bid amount was 40K.

A member of the Public, Mike Driscoll mentioned that the sale would generate tax revenue now and possibly more in the future with possibility of a future structure.

Reynertson clarified that the intent is to keep the lot the way it is now. At this time, there are no plans to move the road. Reynertson would take care of it (the road issue) through an easement process: a replat would not be required.

A motion was made by Councilman Glover to direct CM Reynertson to have the bidder make payment in lieu of taxes for a ten-year period.

Action: Approved unanimously.

HEA Member Appreciation Day Oct. 19

News Release

HEA will hold a Member Appreciation Day in Seldovia on October 19 at noon in the Multi-Purpose Room. Come join them for food, refreshment, fun, and door prizes. Everyone welcome!

In other HEA news, HEA will take a lead role in developing the power generation portion of Agrium's Kenai Blue Sky coal gasification project. The announcement follows Agrium's recent decision to move ahead with a second stage feasibility study.

The objective of the Kenai Blue Sky project is to site a gasifier and a power generation plant adjacent to Agrium's Kenai Nitrogen Operations facility in Nikiski. The proposed project, if completed, would provide the Agrium facility with the syngas feedstock needed to manufacture ammonia and urea. In addition, the project provides the opportunity to supply the Railbelt area with stable, competitively priced power.

"As we continue to deal with the rising cost of natural gas, the opportunity to work with Agrium on the Kenai Blue Sky project is very exciting. Homer Electric is continuing to study all available options to reduce the dependence on natural gas as the source for power generation," said Brad Janorschke, HEA General Manager.

The Kenai Blue Sky project envisions building a 200-megawatt power plant that would supply 120 -130 megawatts of power to the Agrium facility. The additional 70 megawatts would be available to the Railbelt power grid.

Homer Electric Association currently purchases the majority of its power from Chugach Electric Association. The Chugach power supply contract expires on December 31, 2013 . Janorschke says Homer Electric is interested in developing a variety of power generation sources that will provide members with low cost, reliable power for many years to come.

"In addition to the potential power from Kenai Blue Sky, Homer Electric continues to work with the State on the re-start of the Healy Clean Coal Project and we are partners with other utilities in the development of the Fire Island Wind Project. The projects, along with the continued hydroelectric generation at Bradley Lake, offer a balanced source of generation that should help control electric rates charged to our members," said Janorschke.

Phase 2 of the Kenai Blue Sky coal gasification project is expected to take about 18 months to complete. The tentative time line anticipates the project could be operational as early as 2011

City Manager's Corner

- We are still awaiting the State inspectors to come and certify the elevator in the Community Center. They have promised us and missed several dates already to do the certification. The latest date they have

given us is October 9th. They have assured me that this date will not be missed.

- The City is now accepting applications for a VISTA Member to become the grant writer for the City. This position is funded through RurAL CAP and USDA. It pays approximately \$1080 a month. Additionally it pays either a stipend of \$1200 or an education award of \$4725 after completing one year of service. Applications can be picked up from the City Office and are due to RurAL CAP no later than November 3 rd. The start date will be January of 2007.
- We have received the State Fire Marshall permit for the work being performed on the bulk fuel and fuel line project.
- We have received the re-bid of the small boat harbor that prices the de-scoping effort. The materials for the harbor project are arriving and are being put in the project material laydown area. This area is the 14 day parking lot near the Harbor Master Building.
- The Public Works employees will start preparing to winterize the city in the next couple of weeks. Included will be shutting off water to the Harbor, flushing all fire hydrants and winterizing the wet fire hydrants, shutting off the water and pressure washer system located at the boat wash building, and insuring city storm drains are clear of debris.
- I have had several discussions with Amphibious Forces Memorial Museum concerning the Husky II. They have an interest in obtaining the vessel (letter in lay down packet) and moving it to Vancouver, Washington.

Seldovia Police Report by *A.W. Anderson, Chief of Police*

Two different classes from Paul Banks Elementary School in Homer came by the Police Department for a tour of both the Police Department and the Fire Department. They were given a tour of both facilities and shown the equipment that is used in emergency responses.

The area has been over run with black bears this year and it doesn't seem to be slowing down. Police have responded to numerous calls in and outside the City regarding nuisance bears and/or dangerous circumstances due to the bear's presence. Deterrent methods are being used when the Officer does arrive in time to observe the animals. On many calls the bears have entered the dense underbrush and cannot be seen when Police arrive. Police efforts do continue in hopes the bears can be discouraged from being in the presence of people. Please keep calling and we will do our best to respond in a timely manner in hopes we can be that deterrent.

A lady reported her blue bicycle, with silver fenders and a black seat, that has holes in it from birds, was taken from the harbor area. Anyone having information as to the location of the bike is asked to contact the Police Department.

Police assisted a motorist after observing his vehicle was stalled on the Seldovia Slough Bridge. The vehicle was taken back to the airport and parked until it could be repaired.

The report of a Danforth boat anchor being stolen out of a skiff in Jakolof Bay Harbor was received. It had been taken sometime during the month of August.

A man reported the underside of a strut on his aircraft appeared to have been scratched with a key. The area damaged is in a location that would rule out damage other than being done intentionally. A real concern is what else may have been tampered with. Anyone tampering with an aircraft could be charged under Federal Law and the penalties are quite severe. Anyone having any information regarding this type activity should contact the Police.

A local contractor requested assistance in removing the vehicles from the 14 day parking lot at the harbor so a staging area could be developed for the upcoming harbor restoration. Two of the four owners were contacted and keys were furnished for their removal. The other two vehicles had to be moved by the contractor.

A man reported his gray and black Motorola cell phone was lost somewhere in the Jakolof Bay area. Anyone finding the phone is asked to turn it in at the Police Department.

The investigation into a report by three persons of a vehicle driving recklessly on Rocky Road resulted in a young man being charged with Minor Consuming Alcohol, Minor Operating a Motor Vehicle After Consuming Alcohol, Negligent Driving and Failure to Carry and Show Proof of Insurance. The subject will be arraigned on these charges during the 1 st week of October.

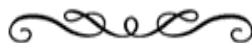

Two of the bullets were heard by both the complainant and her friend as they passed near them. Due to their repeated calling out to the shooter, they felt whoever was shooting knew of their presence. Anyone having information regarding this incident is asked to contact the Police. This type of activity in a populated area is not acceptable. Those persons responsible could be charged with "Reckless Endangerment".

A lady called requesting a message be delivered to her husband regarding his returning to their home on Tuesday's ferry. He was planning a return trip on the Thursday ferry but there was no Thursday boat. The man could not be located, however, and the message was later delivered by his wife when he called her, however too late for his return on Tuesday.

A lady reported damage to her vehicle, which was parked in the parking lot of Homer Air, sometime after noon on 9/25/06 and before 6:00 p.m. on 9/26/06. The two back tires on her vehicle had been stabbed repeatedly with a sharp instrument, thought to be a small knife. Investigation into the incident continues. Anyone having information in this matter is asked to contact the Police Department.

A man reported a UPS package that was shipped on 9/21/06, to the Seldovia office of Smokey Bay Air, has been stolen. The complainant was out of town at the time the shipment was delivered but upon returning a few days later was unable to locate the package.

Since last report the Police Department have notarized 8 documents and assisted the Maintenance Department in two boat haul outs.
