(Did you know, you can throw a small cooler in the water on the end of a rope and it can work as a life preserver? I didn't.) Then there was the station where a coast guard guy taught you about the different PFD's (personal floatation device) or as people call them lifejackets. There was a station where you learned how to get into a survival suit. (Trust me it isn't pleasant but it will keep you alive.) Then the expert taught the formations a group would form once in the water (and we practiced them). The last station was the one that taught you about a life raft.

Track Finale

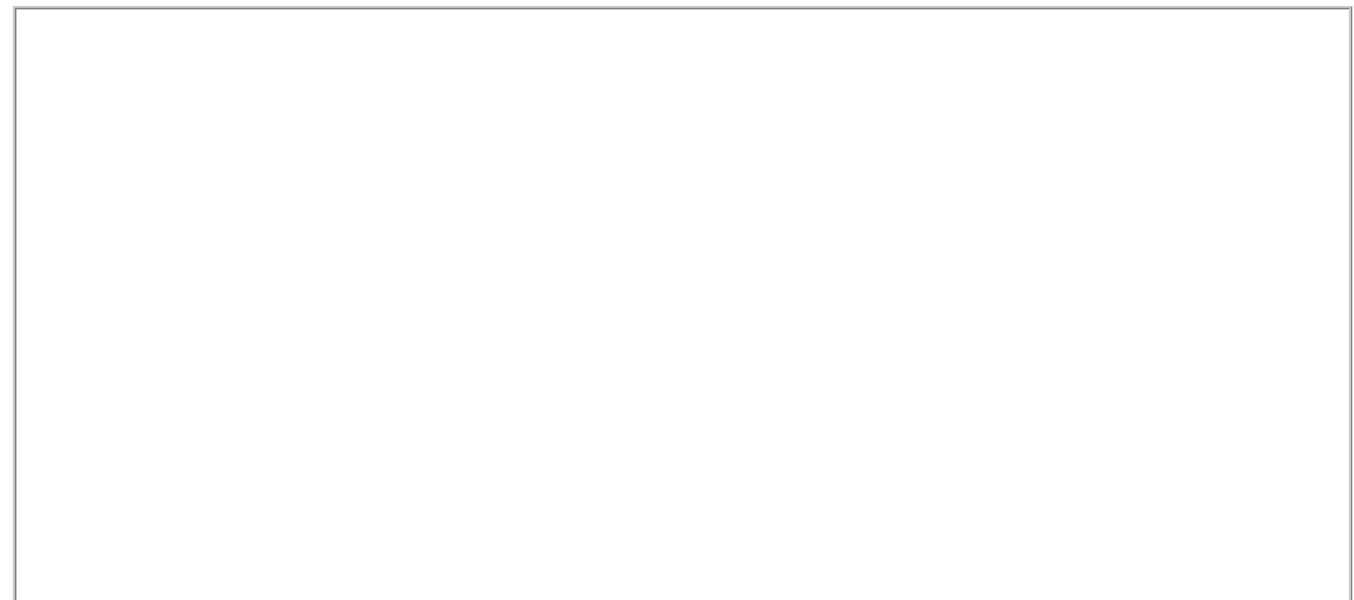
