Treasurer's Report

Old Business

Action Donations – Diane Gruber

In regard to some of the donation solicitation ideas that were fabricated in the last meeting, Mrs. Gruber put together a system for contacting businesses and local craftsmen. She showed the Booster Club members her stack of business contact forms for each student. Each paper had one to two business numbers on it for the student to call to ask for donations. Attached to the numbers was a note home to parents to explain what their child should be doing. The students that will be receiving these numbers are 6th through 11th graders (seniors were omitted on purpose as a senior perk). Students are to call the numbers as soon as possible and ask that donations be in no later than May 1st. Mrs. Gruber will follow up with each student to make sure they contacted the businesses.

Field Trip Change

The Life Skills class has changed their field trip destination from New York/Boston to San Francisco. This change occurred because the district deemed a trip back East to be too risky. Booster will still pay the costs of the flight from Seldovia to Homer and for gas from Homer to Anchorage.

New Business

Palmer Bailey, the man in charge of doing radio commentary during the Small Schools Tournament in basketball, has been paying for gas money out of his own pocket to get to the games to announce. A motion was accepted that would allow Booster to send Mr. Bailey a 100 dollar thank you for announcing at the games.

School Board Report

Mrs. Hilts stated that Booster had hoped to receive half a million dollars out of the state budget, but the budget was not passed by the state. Mrs. Hilts went on to say that we are eligible to apply for 75,000 dollars of money for in state travel for sending kids to things like Spelling Bees' and Basketball State Championships' as long as the travel is inside Alaska.

The junior high volleyball team made quite an upset at the small school regions last weekend. Due to an incident the volleyball team lost one of their six players, leaving them with only five. This could have meant that they would not have been able to go to the final tournament, except the Kenai Peninsula School District agreed to let the team compete one "man" short. This meant the girls would go against teams of six, this being a distinct disadvantage. Though the team didn't bring home the first place plaque, they did bring home the *second* place trophy.

The tourney consisted of six teams. Chapman, Cook Inlet Academy, Homer "B" and "C", Nikolaevsk, Ninilchik, and Seldovia; the bracket was set in a round robin, where everyone played everyone. The only strange thing that did not fit was instead of playing two out of three games in a match, each team played two games against every team no matter what. So these were technically not real "matches." The matches started Friday and continued all day Saturday.

On Friday the Sea Otter girls played Homer "B" and Ninilchik. In the first game the Sea Otters' split the wins with Homer "B" 1-1. They then stepped it up and beat Ninilchik 2-0. On Saturday the Otters' played the other three remaining teams. The Chapman game was first with the Otters winning 2-0. Then, they played Homer "C", again taking the match 2-0. The final game was the decisive game. The Otters' were 9-1 and CIA was 10-0. If the Otters won both games they would take first. They played like they owned that court during the first game, beating CIA by ten points. The second game however, took a turn for the worse when things between a couple of players went sour and affected the team as a whole. This resulted in the Otters losing the last game, seeding them second in the Small School Tourney.
