First In Six Years!

What a weekend! The Susan B. English Sea Otter Volleyball team traveled north to Tok for competition in the 2008 Borealis 2A Regional Tournament. There were a total of twelve teams that participated in this tourney. The seeding for teams in the tournament was determined by their win-loss record from season play. The Sea Otters came in seeded 5 th. Which means they were in for a "fight" to make their way to the championship match. The "weekend" started early when the team left Tuesday, December 2 nd, to drive to Anchorage. From there the team resumed travel on Wednesday to finish the road trip to Tok; play began Thursday morning.

The Otters' first game was against Birchwood Christian. The Otters took the match in three games. (All matches at this tourney were best of five.) The Otters then played the Nikolaevsk Warriors. The team went out fired-up and ready to play, taking the first game 25-6. This did not reflect on the rest of the games in the match. The Otters took the second game, lost the third, and then finished by taking the fourth. This put them against the first seed (home team Tok) on Friday.

Friday came with the Otters concentrating on getting some homework accomplished then warming up for the game of the season. Each player knew that if they won this match they were guaranteed a seed to the State Championships. The Otters went out more motivated than ever before. The Otters' won the match in three games, the scores 25-12, 25-11, and 26-24. This put the Otters in position to play the Kenny Lake Hawks in the championship match on Saturday.

After a good night's rest, game time came and the Otters began their rally. The team took the first game, 25-14. The second game was closer with the score 25-21. The final game was a heart stopping 27-25 win for the Otters, making them the regional champions for the first time since the 2002 season.

At the award ceremony Katie O'Leary and Chelsea Suydam received All Academic Team awards and Katie O'Leary was voted on to the All Tournament Team. Then the Otter team went forward and received their 1 st place trophy and game ball.

The Otter Volleyball team will be competing at the 1A, 2A, and 3A West State Championship tournament starting Thursday, December 11 th, at Dimond High School, in Anchorage. The first game is at 3:45 against Dillingham. Stay tuned for the exciting state coverage!

Planning and Zoning Commission Meeting December 1

The Seldovia P&Z convened together to include the following members present: Dan Blodgett, Paulie Carluccio (chair), Jim Hopkins, Tom Keesecker and Bobbi Sweatt.

Public Comments Regarding Items Not on the Agenda: A member of the Public, *Walt Sonen*, felt the building height of 28' was the correct height, "...lesser is better." He recalled a time when there were shorter heights adopted on the boardwalk in the past. *Tim Dillon* (builder), expected building height to be on today's agenda. City Council member *Walter McInnes*, agreed with Sonen stating building height negatively impacts the availability of winter sunlight.

Oath of Office for newly Appointed P&Z Commission Members: Newly appointed Commission Members *Jim Hopkins* and *Tom Keesecker* were sworn in for their respective seats.

Variance and Building Permit submitted by Gerald Stranik, Tideland Survey T-28 and T-29: This variance will be granted with several stipulations to be followed for approval. **Action:** Approved

City Council Meeting December 10

The Seldovia City Council convened together to include the following members present: John Colberg, Tom Glover, Dean Lent, Walter McInnes, Allison Miller and Gerry Patrick. Mayor Keith Gain presided; City Manager Tim Dillon was in attendance with Deputy City Clerk Mary Klinger taking minutes.

Ordinance Introduction

Ordinance 09-10, An Ordinance of the City Council amending Title 18 of the Seldovia Municipal Code, Section 18.32.080 Building Height:

Action: Unanimously adopted.

Public Presentation Prior Notice

Update from Village Safe Water (Lynn Merino), CRW Engineering (Pete Bellezza and Jeff Lindquist) on the Water and Sewer Upgrade Project.

This presentation given dually by Ms. Merino and Mr. Bellezza was an overview of the infrastructure improvements that were begun this past summer of 2008 and will continue in the near future. In summary, the presentation detailed planned and unscheduled improvements, their time line, cost and continuation. A copy of this report can be obtained from the City Offices.

Public Presentation for Items not on Agenda

A few members of the Public commented on items on the agenda. *Walt Sonen* mentioned that he was one of the “culprits” whom lived on the boardwalk wishing to find resolution to the “freezing water” issue that is such a challenge to him and other residents in this particular vicinity. He would like to be informed of future workshops or endeavors directed at correcting this issue. *Dick Wyland* emphasized the eventual need for a second water tank, citing the fire of 2006 as an example of a full-drain on our singular tank, in addition to just being on the safe side with water availability. *Tamara Blodgett* said she was “very pleased” with the care and diligence taken while the direct impact of the CRW project was going on near her residence.

Committee and Advisory Board Reports

P&Z Commission Chair, Paulie Carluccio, gave an overview of the last meeting on the 1 st. The Gateway Park Presentation given by Chamber of Commerce President Peggy Keesecker was heard. *Carluccio* stated that she felt that this needed to be addressed at a future (January 2009) joint

workshop with Parks & Rec., Council and P&Z in attendance so that these various projects would not overlap or “trip over each other.” This streamlining effort may circumvent confusion amongst the different entities that are striving for unity with community improvement projects. In regard to the building height issue, Carluccio would like to see this come before Council as well. *Mayor Gain* was purposeful with this ordinance introduction at this time as springtime construction projects will need resolution on this issue before they commence.

Old Business

Ordinance 09-08, An Ordinance of the City of Seldovia Amending the Seldovia Sales Tax to be levied on Non-prepared Food Items:

The public voted to get rid of this taxation as did several other Kenai Peninsula cities, except Homer. It has now come to light that this taxation was a crucial component of balancing city budgets, none more so than Seldovia’s. There is a currently, a wide repeal movement. Mayor Gain said that he would monitor this taxation carefully but right now the City needs the 20-30K revenue that this generates. He and Councilman McInnes were on Council when the move to start a [lesser] winter taxation was begun and he is sensitive to balancing the needs of City revenue with what is fair to the resident(s).

Action: Approved unanimously for adoption.

Recommend to Reconsider Ordinance 09-07, An Ordinance of the City Council of the city of Seldovia , Amending Title II of the Seldovia Municipal Code, section 2.22.010 Fire Department, Changing the name of the Seldovia *Volunteer* Fire and Rescue to **Seldovia Volunteer Fire and EMS**. This is a simple inclusion of the term, “volunteer,” which was wrongly omitted at the last Council meeting. **Action:** Approved unanimously for adoption.

City Dock Electrical Improvements:

Mayor Gain called on a Council vote to temporarily suspend the rules of procurement as they pertain to the “three-quote” minimum as a basis for electrical work to proceed. He commented that this has always been a “nightmare” in the past and wishes to expedite this process with the two quotes already in the possession of City Manager Dillon.

Action: Approved unanimously.

City Manager’s Report , see below.

Manager, Council and Mayor Comments Concerning Items not on the Agenda

Councilman McInnes wished to compliment and thank the comprehensive presentation given by CRW representatives Bellezza and Merino. Additionally, he supports a workshop in which the, “...interest of all parties to express and discuss varied viewpoints” is an option. He further wished to make a public mention that the airport impound project was begun by the DOT, not the City of Seldovia .

Several Council Members expressed and thanks for the well-done CRW presentation in addition to wishing all a “Merry Christmas.”

Alaska Senate Seeking Pages for the 2009 Session

Senator Gary Stevens, Press Release, November 28, 2008

The Alaska State Senate is seeking individuals who are interested and available to work as a Legislative Page in Juneau during the 2009 legislative session. *Legislative Page* positions are employed from just prior to the beginning of a legislative session to a few days after adjournment.

Senator Gary Stevens (R-Kodiak), who will serve as Senate President for the 26th Alaska State Legislature, is encouraging interested constituents to apply for a page position:

“With a wide variety of tasks critical to the successful operation of the legislature, the page program also offers anybody interested in the workings of the legislature and state government a tremendous opportunity to get practical, hands-on experience. Often, service as a page opens a door to future employment with the legislature or state agencies,” Senator Stevens explained. “If you have an interest in being a page, please apply as soon as possible.”

The 90 day legislative session begins Tuesday, January, 20, 2009, through April 19, 2009. The starting salary for a Page position is \$2,925.00 per month. All monthly paid employees receive full medical, retirement and leave benefits. Salaried employees do not receive compensatory time or overtime and are on call 7 days per week.

The minimum age requirement is 18 years of age and a valid driver's license is required. Hired by the Senate Rules Committee, pages serve under the supervision of their Sergeant-At-Arms to provide support services to legislative members. They are on call in the Chamber for each legislative day providing such services as:

Acting as doormen of the chambers.

- Remaining on call in the chamber during session.
- Relaying messages, letters and documents both to and from the legislators and to and from legislative offices and agencies. Setting up committee rooms for legislative meetings. Working in legislative offices as needed.
- Maintaining the bills, journals and other documents used in the chambers.
- Driving the legislative vans as requested.
- Other duties as assigned.

Interested individuals should send a copy of their resume and a copy of their Department of Motor Vehicles driving record to the Senate Rules Committee, as soon as possible, **and no later than December 18, 2008.**

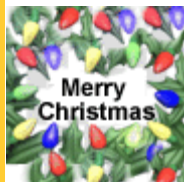
