We are of a sub-tropical climate and are currently experiencing our wet season. We have been in drought for many years to the point that we were very close to running out of water last year. The town of Mt Isa in North Queensland is a mining town, they had 100 days of water left until about a week ago and now they have more water than they know what to do with. We are a land of contrasts as far as the weather goes. Bushfires have been raging in the southern states. The tennis, cricket and yacht racing have been on. My home is located 1 kilometre from Moreton Bay, locally we have Dugongs, turtles and fish in the Bay. The great whale migration occurs every year and is a great tourist attraction, but they do not come through the bay but go on the ocean side of the islands. We have Stradbroke Island, Moreton Island and Tangalooma Islands nearby, which gives us still water in the bay, a great breeding ground for some species of sea life. Fraser Island the largest sand island is about 3 hours drive north from us. We have the Australia Zoo about 1 hour north as well. It is a spectacular place and a credit to the Irwin's.
